Our front gate guards are on duty from 6:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. Due to on-going construction and continued

sales, the gates will remain open during the day, and a roving-guard will patrol the community from 4:30 p.m. to 7:30 a.m.

If you do not have a barcode on your vehicle, then you must enter the community through the guest lane and be prepared to show a photo ID to the guard on duty. All non-residents entering our community after hours are now be required to stop at the guardhouse before entering.

THE NEXT STEP: Residents will need to enter their guests' names into the gate access website. Instruction sheets can be picked up at the Resident Services desk that will include your personal PIN code that will be needed to add your permanent and/or temporary guests' names to the new system. If you have not received your instruction sheet. Please pick it up during regular Management office hours: Monday – Friday 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and Saturday – Sunday 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

DID YOU KNOW? The Palm Beach County Burglar Alarm Ordinance requires everyone operating an alarm system within the county to register their system by obtaining a permit from the Sheriff's Office. The ordinance was put into place to inform residents and business owners of the causes of false alarms and the prevention techniques to reduce them.

There is a fee of \$25.00 for the initial registration and a \$25.00 renewal fee each year.

You can register your alarm system online at alarms.pbso.org:

- Click on "Apply for new permit" at the bottom of the page.
- Read and accept terms.
- Enter your personal information.
- At "Monitored by" section, choose C.O.P.S. (1162).
- At "Sold by" section. Choose VITEX / UXARI (1807).
- Create password and submit application.
- Provide your payment information.

You will then be registered and will receive a permit number for your records.
